Introduction

Art at Present

This exhibition presented in Switzerland, consists of 12 young artists from various art academies in China. All of them work primarily in the medium of ink on paper. Although their artistic approaches and subject matters vary, each driven by different focus in their practice, yet their inextricable connections to traditional Chinese painters are apparent. Among the works of Bian Kai, Chen Sanyin, Liang Guifeng and Hao Wei, the impact of classical Chinese painting, and in particular calligraphy are critical in understanding their works. All of the artists have honed their techniques and trainings over time and adopted them into their own languages – known as the brushworks (笔墨, bi mo) in Chinese painting. Likewise, as the traditional literati painters would call their works "a few whimsical strokes, to amuse oneself", expressing their emotions through painting subjects such as "landscapes, or birds and flowers" that were seemingly irrelevant to social political issues; the works of the artists such as Gu Haitao, Fan Handong and Wang Yiwei also expand from observing lives around them. Yet we should not naively believe their seemingly dissociative attitude towards social reality, just as we cannot simple separate Zhao Mengfu's famous painting, Twin Pines, Level Distance from its era - separating from the context of Mongolian ruling class. Artists Shi Lei, Peng Zhenzhong, Shi Bowen and Wang Chao are further exploring possibilities of painting on paper beyond the existing motifs in order to expand the boundary of painting.

Is this the only historical development?

For Western viewers, over the long historical development of Chinese painting, it would often seem stagnant, and impossible to appropriate the same developmental progress from the history of Western art since the Renaissance.

For example, "originality" has been one of the primary characteristics in Western art, as was gradually indoctrinated in the 20th century. On the other hand, it had already been a common reality among literati painters in the 16th century, would such phenomenon make us skeptical and ambivalent of the single path of development to engender art theory? I think, a series of mutual inquiries is not aimed at a "true victory", but rather focusing on the positive effect in the development of art through mutual communications. Historically speaking, as early as Buddhism came into China and its impact on Chinese visual art, to the impact of Ukiyo-e on the West, such cultural encounters have occurred time and time again in pushing forward the artistic language of the other.

The past is a foreign country, they do things differently there.

Whether it is the East or the West, the artists would have never foreseen the present at the end of the 19th Century. Rapid modes of communication and technology to disseminate information have completely reduced the distance between the two. When the East meets the West face to face, would they actually be able to communicate, and willingly to express one's ideas to the other in full? Or would they withhold one's academic standard in favor of the other's understanding? Or would any party adopt the mechanical translations of each other's works to put on the façade of satisfaction? These are the issues we need to face today.





This exhibition "Paint the Past with the Present", presents 12 Chinese young artists selected among the participants of the project IVY ART China. It also plays the role of a showcase, which examine the development of Chinese traditional painting during this era of globalization.

Since the 20th century, worldwide, globalization is appearing, as a key issue of our Society. This phenomenon impacts deeply the social, economic and cultural areas. The planet is becoming smaller and horizontalized. However, once people are free and have more convenience to live and work, anywhere in the world, their traditions, languages and cultures will slowly disappear over generations of intermarriage and dispersal. In terms of art, a negative fact of globalization is the slow disintegration of differences. It seems more significant among the new generations who are using the same social networking websites and even the same art history textbook. Therefore, it has been more and more difficult to recognize a piece of artwork which is finished by a West or by a Chinese artist. Indeed, the geographic boundaries are blurred, and the impact of "global art" is obvious.

However, from another point of view, artist has more space to move around, communicate and choose objects. Artists are no longer stereotyped by regions, mediums or ages, but are regrouped by interests, forms or art languages. This is the so called "Localization Shift" belonging to the globalization movement.

The IVY ART project, as a long term art project, focusing on China's young artists generation, has intensively discussed about "globalization" and "localization" during the last 3 years. In 2016, IVY ART is honored to cooperate with the Foundation Alpes Encre de Chine and to illustrate "localized" art in a globalized circumstance. The exhibition is also an epitome of the diversity of Chinese traditional painting development. Further, IVY ART is looking forward to hold hands with the Foundation in order to develop more exchanges between Chinese and European artists in diversified scales. Last but not least, we have to appreciate that we were born in this era of globalization, which makes all of us possible to dialogue and exhibit our art without gap.
